## TSSC/T2KR New Year Run 2026



Start from Queen's Square Car Park, Attleborough, NR17 2QW from 10.30am.

Ending at Forncett Industrial Steam Museum, Low Road, Forncett St Mary, NR16 1JJ, around 11.30am for bacon roll and a cuppa. There is a £10 entrance charge per person at the museum which includes a cuppa and a bacon roll, entrance to the museum with guided tour\*.

We've got a short route this year of approximately 15 miles and should take around 40 minutes. Note that there are two fords to cross, but there is an alternative route to miss out the first one.

This is **NOT** a timed event, rather an enjoyable amble around the boundary of Norfolk. All timings are approximate and allow enough time to be able to drive sensibly.

You are advised to comply with all Road Traffic Regulations and Speed Limits.

Please note that some roads might be frosty and slippery please take care.

Some roads are narrow with blind bends. Please be careful of horses, cyclists and walkers.

We advise entrants not to bunch up or form convoys and to respect other road users.

Everybody wants to travel at their own speed - if you find a trail of Triumphs behind you please pull over and let them pass.


And finally, remember it's meant to be fun, if things get fraught please just put the relevant postcode into your SatNav and go straight there.

Junctions that go from a major to a minor road, which you will need to look out for, are marked

Turn right out of car park



Turn left at give-way



Go past St Marys Church and turn right at lights, signed Diss B1077



Go over level crossing and carry on for 23/4 miles into Old Buckenham



Go through pedestrian lights and turn right (unsigned)



Turn right at give-way (unsigned)



Take first right (unsigned) to continue around the green



Turn left at give-way (unsigned)



Go past Old Buckenham Storage on right and take first left signed New Buckenham



Take first left (unsigned)

Tulip Directions Sheet 2



Go past Old Buckenham Windmill on right This mill was built for John Burlingham in 1818. It stopped working commercially in 1926. It is a Grade II\* listed building. The brick-built mill is notable as having the widest tower in England. It also has the largest cap.



Turn right at give-way (unsigned)



Turn left at give-way signed Norwich, New Buckenham onto B1113



Go into New Buckenham and past the Market House a grade II-star listed building which features a whipping post.



Stay on B1113 for 3 miles going into Bunwell and turn right opposite village sign, signed Bunwell Hill



Turn left at give-way signed Aslacton and Tibenham



After 1/2 mile take right hand fork on bend signed Tibenham and unbridged ford onto Hall Road



To miss the ford do not take right turn above but continue straight on (go to direction  $\mathbf{A}$ )



Turn left at give-way signed Aslacton onto Low Road.



Go over Malturo Bridge



Turn right at give-way signed Aslacton, Forncett St Peter on to Low Common Road to rejoin route if missing ford



(A) Go over 2nd (small) ford (not the ford at Steeple Lane!) and turn right at give-way and then left at next give-way signed Long Stratton



Go into Forncett and at give-way go straight on at bend



Take the next left fork on bend signed Forncett St Mary and Museum onto Low Road



Carry on through Forncett and turn right into Forncett Steam Museum (NR16 1JJ)
